During this school year effort of the staff was directed toward study and evaluation of the Non-Academic Courses. Listed below are the changes which will take place next school term:

- 1. Business Education: We will offer advanced business laboratory classes carrying 2 units of credit rather than the single unit courses offered this year.
- 2. Art: the number of students participating in the Art program will double for the next term.
- 3. Homemaking: We will offer an advanced course for the 11th and 12th graders in the Academic program.
- 4. Music: Almost half the student body will be involved in some type of music program.
